CARDIOLOGY

March 6, 2024

With Sonya Gordon, DVM, DVSc, Diplomate ACVIM

She will cover unusual diagnoses in exotic companion mammals, but the typical diagnostic algorithm utilized for each case will be detailed and common differential diagnoses will be discussed for multiple exotic companion mammals. Also discussed will be emergency triage and management in avian patients.



SURGERY

Lectures will consist of a variety of practical soft tissue surgery techniques that most veterinarians can perform in their practice. Video segments of clinical case material will be used as a means of delivering surgical lectures. Topics will consist of respiratory, gastrointestinal and urinary surgery cases.



BEHAVIOR

Enhance your understanding of psychopharmacology and its implications in behavior-related issues, and critically analyze prevalent myths surrounding behavior problems and management methodologies.



THERIO/REPRODUCTION

December 11, 2024

Dr. Greer will take a long look into canine reproduction. Hormones: cycle, level measurement, which hormone to measure and which instruments to use. She'll also take an in-depth look at the whelping process and neonatal care including causes of puppy loss, passive immunity vs. ab titer measurements, the "pandemic puppy", preventative care, and neonatal development; and so much more.
