## PARASITOLOGY

May 6, 2026

With Andy Moorhead, DVM, MS, PhD,  
DACVM (Parasitology)

This session will cover prevention and treatment of heartworm and major intestinal helminths—hookworms, roundworms, whipworms, and tapeworms. Topics include parasite biology, diagnostics, treatment, and life cycles, with a focus on key stages for diagnosis and control. Emphasis will be placed on prevention and emerging cases of treatment resistance, including current approaches to diagnosis and management.



## TOXICOLOGY

June 17, 2026

With Renee D. Schmid, DVM, DABT, DABVT

Ready to dig into toxicology? Dr. Renee Schmid, Director of Veterinary Toxicology and Senior Veterinary Toxicologist with Pet Poison Helpline will guide attendees through the vast terrain of small animal toxicology. The day will start with a review of general aspects of approaching a potentially poisoned patient, discussing ideal medications to have in your clinic, and choosing the appropriate decontamination method for your patient. As the day progresses, we will discuss a variety of specific toxins, ranging from chocolate to heroin, and everything in between!



## CHRONIC ENTEROPATHIES

September 16, 2026

With Kasey Mabry, DVM, MS, DACVIM (SAIM)

Dr. Mabry will review updated classifications for chronic inflammatory enteropathies in dogs and cats. The pathogenesis and novel diagnostic and treatment options for each classification in dogs will be discussed, including food-responsive enteropathy, antibiotic- or microbiota-related modulation-responsive enteropathy, immunosuppressant-responsive enteropathy, protein losing enteropathy, and non-responsive enteropathy. In cats, differentiation between food-responsive enteropathy, idiopathic inflammatory bowel disease, and alimentary small cell lymphoma will also be reviewed.



## ONCOLOGY

November 11, 2026

With Timothy M. Fan, DVM, PhD, DACVIM

Dr. Fan will be giving updates on diagnosis and treatment of many of the most challenging tumors encountered in both dogs and cats. Highlights will center around ongoing clinical trials that seek to improve the control of cancer through either earlier detection methods or improved treatment options. In particular, how the immune system can be harnessed to fight cancer will be emphasized and novel strategies that have begun to be evaluated in pets reviewed.



## RADIOLOGY

December 16, 2026

With Marc Lee, DVM, DACVR

This interactive session will focus on the identification and interpretation of common thoracic and abdominal radiographic abnormalities through a case-based approach. Attendees will engage in the systematic review of representative cases, gaining practical insights into key disease processes and radiographic patterns.
